Message from Rabbi Rachael Jackson



Each day, I check the high temperature for Hendersonville. Each degree corresponds to a particular color which I then find based on the temperature. I take that color and cross stitch it as one segment of a spiral galaxy. Beyond creating a unique piece of art and

feeding my hobby need, I am encouraged to pay attention to every day.

It is easy to let the days meld into one another. It is easy to let each day be washed away by the next like waves repeatedly erasing the shore line. It takes intentionality to make each day unique.

There are a myriad of ways to engage every day. We are only given so many days on this earth. So many of them are filled with the mundane and the banal, with chores and errands. It's our duty to ourselves and to the world that we act with intentionality whenever we're able.

Whatever you choose, however you choose it, ask yourself: "How is today going to be different than vesterday or tomorrow?"

My, this year has gone by fast!

Our fiscal year ends on June 30 and this month will be our Annual meeting. The Board of Trustees has approved a budget and we have a slate of officers and trustees (some new and some not so new) that are ready and eager to serve. Hope to see you at the **Annual meeting** to be held on **Sunday, June 19**, starting at 10:30am at the synagogue.

The Pandemic Task Force met and has recommended to the Board that we re-introduce Onegs to our Friday night services. The Board has adopted the recommendation of the Task Force and we are aiming to have Onegs starting July 1, 2022. This is wonderful news! We will be limiting the Onegs to challah, wine and grape juice. We have formed an Oneg Committee, which will be responsible for putting out and cleaning up the food. The challah will be pre-sliced and the beverages will be pre-poured, with each person being able to serve themselves.

The new front doors have been installed and are working perfectly. The lock has been changed so if you have a key from the old door it will not work. New keys are being distributed in limited quantities. If you need to enter the building, it is best to do so during our normal working hours, 10am to 3pm, Tuesday through Friday. If you need the building during any other times, you will need to let the office know so that entry can be arranged.

You'll not recall this ritual unless you're a hundred years old, but your parents would remember it fondly. Put on your nice outfit, take flowers, wine or something delish to offer and go to Bubbe's house for dinner. There would be a lace tablecloth, flowers, candles and maybe even "tchotchkes" on the table. Everyone in the family was welcome and if they didn't show up they must have been sick or deceased. It was a command performance—a ritual. The young kids would groan because it was always a boring time with grownups with your best table manners on display. The adults would gather to share the week's gossip and the food was "geshmak" (delicious): matzah ball soup, brisket, roasted potatoes, maybe a kugel and a nice coffee cake for dessert. Bubbe was a great cook and Sunday dinner was her masterpiece.

These fond memories will be reprised on **SUNDAY, AUGUST 28TH** at Agudas as we stroll down memory lane at our family tables in 2022. We, too, will have lace tablecloths and flowers and wine and brisket. We, too, will fondly honor times past as we share in the **100TH ANNIVERSARY GALA DINNER AT AGUDAS**. There will also be historical information on display as we combine our canceled July History Night with our Gala, inviting Hendersonville's leadership to join us for an authentic Jewish meal and remember Bubbe's welcoming and delicious ritual of "breaking Challah" together. There will be surprises galore as we reprise our traditions and share them with our "mishpocheh" (*a Jewish family or social unit including close and distant relatives*).

Proof of vaccinations and boosters will continue to be checked.


With the rise of COVID in our area and the different variances, mask wearing is again suggested, especially




