### Message from Rabbi Rachael Jackson



Throughout last year, and even more this year, I am frequently finding myself saying "Can you believe it is already ?" whether the blank is 'Shabbat' or 'Wednesday' or 'May' as I'm feeling this month. Moving from one task to another, we run the risk of time passing us by. Especially with spring blooming and the density of the foliage on the trees increasing, the days can just speed by into summer.

Our tradition recognizes this proclivity and attempts to tamper it. From Passover to Shavuot, we have a ritual of Counting the Omer. Every day we focus ourselves on that day. Then we re-focus

ourselves in time in preparation for what is next.

The formula is as follows:

Blessing for the recitation itself. Blessing for the day of the day. Statement of where we are in relation to Shavuot. For example, for May 1:

"Blessed be You Adonai, our God, Ruler of space and time, who made us holy through commandments and commanded us about counting the Omer."

"Today is sixteen days, which is two weeks and two days of the Omer. 33 days until Shavuot."

You'll notice that the omer is counted for 49 days, or 7 weeks of 7 days. We just love the number 7! Additional readings and statements often come from a kabbalistic overlay. This system uses 7 characteristics—understanding, wisdom, might, splendor, beauty, loving-kindness, eternity—and applies one trait each week and then one trait per day therein. For example, May 1 will be loving-kindness within beauty, then May 2 will be might within beauty.

When setting up time in this fashion, we are called to realign ourselves internally and externally to the here and now. We are guided to pay attention. Putting another cliché in a secular way, we are invited to stop and smell the roses.

Whatever this month holds for you, I hope that we are all able to reflect, renew, and realign ourselves to the present.

So the Centennial Celebrations Committee included this as one of our six Centennial events and we are ready to host the community and artists again. It just goes to show that sometimes the craziest ideas grow into traditions. Hence, "Art in the Lot....Again", which will be held on **Sunday, May 22<sup>nd</sup>, 10am-3pm**. This year we are featuring two new tables, "Sew Nice" and "Eclectic Treasures", not to mention an expanded food truck offering, our delicious Bake Sale, music, and another 30 artists.



Feed the Kids is comprised of teams from many faith-based organizations in Henderson County who care about the health and welfare






